Holiday Online Shopping: Advice To Avoid Identity Theft

As I write this month's article, I can't believe the holiday season is just around the corner. I'm looking forward

to our first cold front, the return of our winter residents, and the season of giving and receiving.

Over the next few months, many of you will be visiting stores, both inperson and on-line, looking for holiday sales and one-of-a-kind deals. With Black Friday and Cyber Monday fast approaching, I want to encourage you to remain vigilant about protecting your

finances and personal information from criminals. If you aren't careful about where you shop online, what you click on, and who you share your personal data with, you could become a victim of identity theft or be charged for merchandise you didn't purchase.

I have provided a few safety tips below that you should keep in mind when navigating hundreds of cybermalls this shopping season:

- PAY WITH A CREDIT CARD. If there are problems with your order, a credit card will provide you the best liability protection.
- CHECK OUT THE WEBPAGE SECU-RITY. When you make a purchase on a website, the URL should change to begin with https:// and will show

a green lock icon. The "s" stands for secure, which means all communications between your browser and the website in question are encrypted and secure, using a security certifi-

- DON'T OVERSHARE. No online shopping e-tailer needs your Social Security number or your birthday to do business. If a website requires you to provide this information in order to make a purchase, shut it down.
- WATCH OUT FOR EMAIL SCAMS. Avoid clicking on random emails with "special offers" or alerts claiming that your accounts have been hacked. Clicking on emails from unknown senders could infect your computer with viruses and malware.
- **READ** customer comments, check for complaints, and research the compa-

ny to see if it is a fake.

PAY CLOSE ATTENTION to your credit card statements and bank account information.

Unfortunately, we are all at risk of becoming a victim, including law enforcement. Don't be embarrassed if you've been taken in by a cybercriminal. Instead, report it to our fraud line at 239-258-3292, the Federal Trade Commission at www.ftc.gov, or to the Florida Attorney General's Office at www.myfloridalegal.com.

I hope these tips help prepare you for shopping safely online. Next month, I will talk about "porch pirates" and how you can batten down the hatches to protect your deliveries from being swiped.

As the year progresses and with the COVID-19 effecting many residents we are on track to serve more families than ever with a variety of services; food pantry, utility assistance, Literacy classes, income tax preparation, group support programs, care and share senior food boxes and online food stamp applications, just to name a few of the services provided in Lehigh Acres.

Tax season will begin at the end of January, and appointments will be scheduled for individuals to file their taxes for FREE if the household income is less than \$66,000 per year. The VITA (Volunteer Income Tax Assistance) program will offer evening and Saturday appointments at Lehigh Community Services and a drop off option for those who can't set a standard appointment; spread the word to those you know who can use this service, it is estimated that a family can save around \$250 in tax preparation fees with this free service provided by IRS certified volunteers. Drowsy Driving: Deaths & Injuries Submitted By Jody Van Cooney

How often have you noticed a drowsy driver on the road? According to NHTSA, between 2011 and 2015, total fatal crashes were 153,297 with 2.4 percent due to drowsy driving and 8, 118, 000 involved injuries with 2.0 percent due to drowsy driv-

Drowsy driver crashes can occur virtually any time—late at night, early pre-dawn hours, or mid-afternoon. Drowsiness leads to impaired attention, slow down mental

processing, poor judgment, and poor decision making.

Warning signs of drowsy driving include difficulty remembering the past few miles driven, yawning or blinking frequently, missing an exit, and hitting the rumble strip of the side of the road or center lane.

Teens, ages 13-18, need 8-10 hours of sleep every day; adults need 7-8 hours. Drowsy driving can be caused by lack of sleep, a baby being up all night, late night shift work, staying out with friends, sleep apnea, and health issues. Drivers, age 24 and younger, are nearly twice as likely to be drowsy or fall asleep at the time they have a crash. People sleeping less than five hours increase their risk four to five times more than those who get more than five hours.

Shield 4 Kids: Keep Our Children Safe At Bus Stops By James Branham

In 2016 a Special Highway Immediate Emergency Location Defense, nonprofit 501c3 organization known as S.H.I.E.L.D. was created. This organization is dedicated in protecting all First Responders and tow truck operators by what is known as Blocking or Advance Warning, this allows for a buffer zone to help protect our emergency personnel and for the safety of the public by warning them there is an emergency situation ahead.

We also try to educate as many people as possible on the awareness of MOSD, (move over slow down). Every day, our nation's firefighters, EMTs/ paramedics, state troopers, police officers, sheriff's deputies, tow operators, and departments of transportation responders are exposed to the grave hazards inherent in emergency responses on the nation's highways and roadways.

In 2019, Shield got involved with Benches for Babes and has since then transformed this program into what is known today as Shield 4 Kids. This program was designed to put picnic benches at the bus stops for the children to sit on to give them an alternative to sitting or standing in the roadways and to make them a more visible to oncoming traffic on the roads.

This program was created when 12year old Alana Tamplin was a victim of a hit-and-run while she was near her sister's bus stop in January and 8-yearold Layla Aiken was hit as she sat in the grass with her brothers, waiting for their school bus in March.

Shield 4 Kids has been consistently active in nurturing ways to improve this program every day.

Shield has begun phase 2 of its program to eliminate the picnic benches and evolve into a more suitable bench style that will provide the same safety features and will allow distribution to cover more areas a lot quicker than the current plan.

Shield 4 Kids phase 3 program would involve our responder safety vehicles to be present at the more dangerous bus stops for higher visibility to the traffic passing by to warn them that children are present.

The Shield 4 Kids phase 4 includes a 3 wall enclosed structure mounted on a secure platform which will provide shelter from the elements and solar powered motion detected lighting.

This entire program will work with the support of all the businesses in our communities sponsoring this pro-

Why Cheap Vitamins May Be Toxic and Harmful To Your Health - And Why They Cost You More By Deanna Catalano, RPh

Less expensive vitamins may appear to save you money. In the long run, however, they may very well cost you more money- or even fail to do their job adequately.

All vitamins- as well as most other pharmaceuticals- have certain vital components which are the results of the manufacturing process. These components are:

- ACTIVE INGREDIENT- The specific component that creates the desired response.
- BINDERS- These materials hold a tablet together so the tablet does not dissolve prematurely before reaching the site absorption.
- **DISINTEGRANTS** This component is included to assist the body in the dissolution process. If a tablet or capsule does not dissolve in time, the opportunity for absorption is lost.
- FILLERS- This component is necessary when a very small quantity of active ingredient is used. Without fillers, some medications would be to small for us to handle.
- **PRESERVATIVES** This is sometimes included to extend the time that a compound remains in its desired form. Without preservatives, some compounds may break down into entirely different and possibly hazardous-compounds.
- COATINGS- Some products contain a particular type of coating. Two popular types of coating are:
 - A sugar coating which makes a tablet easier to swallow.
 - · An enteric coating which prevents a tablet from dissolving in the stomach. This is most common on certain forms of aspirin which can be irritating on the delicate stomach lining.

These other ingredients are as important as the active ingredient you are ingesting. In Fact, if any of these ingredients are missing or sub-standard, your medication or vitamin supplement may not be absorbed by your body.

Besides the ingredients themselves, another crucial component in the manufacturing process is the compression process. A tablet that is compressed too hard may not be dissolved regardless of any disintergrants present. This is commonly referred to as a "bed-pan bullet." The only beneficiary is your toilet bowl. Conversely, not enough compression and a tablet could dissolve prematurely. This would leave the compound vulnerable to enzymes and acids which could destroy some or all of the compound before it is absorbed, rendering it useless.

It is important to understand that most absorption occurs in your small intestine. Think of this as a "trap door," where drug, vitamin and nutrient absorption occurs. Anything that is absorbed by your body must be in solution form. Your body does not absorb medicinals or nutrients in solid form. Therefore, it is imperative that the medication be in the right state at the right time. If not, even if some absorption does occur, it is quite possible that the minimum effective (therapeutic) concentration will not be achieved.

Minimum effective concentration refers to the lowest blood level necessary to achieve a successful therapeutic response outcome. This is one of the most important areas that the United States Food and Drug Administration looks at before it allows any drug to reach the consumer. Some other areas that are key in the drug approval process are the time it takes for a dose to reach a therapeutic level and how long that therapeutic level is sustained in your body.

Under current laws, vitamins, minerals, and other nutrients are classified as supplements. Supplements are not regulated by the government and quality control practices are left to the discretion of the manufacturer. As long as a supplement contains the listed strength of the active ingredient, it is allowed into the market. This certainly would be a life threatening practice if these same rules applied to your prescription drug. This significant difference is the difference between Food-Grade and Pharmaceutical Grade. Most vitamin supplements are Food-Grade. The Pharmaceutical-Grade manufacturing process is a very scientifically precise procedure. Quality control is the cornerstone of good manufacturing practices and you should select Pharmaceutical-Grade to ensure maximum benefits and peace of mind.

METRIC SYSTEM IS OFTEN USED AS A MARKETING PLOY

Most Americans are not too familiar with the metric system of measurement. It is quite easy to be led to believe that 3 milligrams is less than 300 micrograms. The truth is that 3 milligrams (mg) is ten times more potent than 300 micrograms (mcg). Clever labeling could mislead you to believe one brand is less expensive than another. An excellent example of this is calcium, an important supplement to prevent Osteoporosis (bone loss). This supplement is readily available in 500 and 600 milligram strengths. Most people are well advised to take 1000 to 1500 milligrams of calcium daily. On the side of these bottles in small print is informational that tells the consumer precisely how much elemental calcium is contained in each tablet. Many of these products contain only 162mg of elemental calcium. A person would have to take almost 10 tablets a day to achieve the recommended dose of 1500mg. Another crucial factor is that less than 33 percent of these forms of calcium are actually absorbed hy your body. The ten tablets are now providing you with only 33 percent of your daily requirement. To achieve 100 percent, you would need to consume almost thirty tablets a day! If you purchased a bottle of 100 tablets for five dollars this would last you three days or fifty dollars a month and you still would have only purchased Food -Grade calcium. Not quite the value you thought. A chelated form of calcium would cost you about fifteen dollars. An absorption rate of 95 percent is achieved with this form of calcium- which is clearly the real "bargain."

Additionally, choose a product that gives you vitamins and minerals in the most bio-available form. (For instance, calcium hydroxyapatite and calcium carbonate are both calcium; However, one is easy for your body to use, while the other will just be excreted).

Make sure that your vitamin is taken more than once a day. While one-a-days may be convenient, they shortchange your health. Choose one that gives you maximum antioxidant protection.

Finally, select your pharmacy as carefully as you would your doctor. When you deal with an independently-owned pharmacy, you are dealing with the individual who determines which products are carried in his or her store. Consult your independent pharmacist regarding which products are the most effective and provide the best value for you.

Autumn Pet Safety

Chrysanthemum flowers and the Autumn Crocus plant are extremely toxic to your pet. If your pet ingests any part of the these plants it can cause a series of aliments up to and including death.

It's officially Fall. We love this time of year and so do our pets. We must make sure that we protect our pets from hidden dangers of this season. Below are some tips to help keep your pets safe during the autumn

RODENTICIDES (RAT POISONS)

As the days are getting shorter and cooler, mice and rats will begin looking for a place to call their winter home. To control unwanted visitors many homeowners will put out rat poisons. If you use these products in your home, make sure to keep them out of reach of pets. These chemicals are toxic and potentially deadly for your pets. Whether your pet eats the poison directly or your pet ingests a poisoned rodent each has the potential to kill your pet. They should be taken to your veterinarian immediately. Make sure to bring the label from the product (or a picture of the entire box) with you so your veterinarian can determine the right course of treatment for your pet.

Remember, when placing this product around your home make sure to keep it away from all your pets and quickly pick up any deceased rodents around your yard to prevent accidental ingestion and exposure to these poisons.

PLANT AND MUSHROOM POISONING

Mushrooms tend to pop up around this time of the year. While not all mushrooms are poisonous, it can be hard to tell which ones are safe. For this reason, it is best to consider all mushrooms growing in your yard or out in nature poisonous.

If your pet does munch on a mushroom, call your vet immediately. Mild toxicity can cause gastrointestinal upset, like vomiting and diarrhea. Severe toxicity can cause neurological, kidney, and liver damage, or even death depending on what type of mushroom was eaten.

This product is highly toxic and should be kept far out of your pets reach. Antifreeze contains a chemical called ethylene glycol and pets are attracted to its sweet taste. However, if a pet ingests even a small amount, there can be serious, and even fatal, consequences. Signs of early poisoning include acting drunk or uncoordinated, excessive thirst, and lethargy.

ANTIFREEZE

If you fear your pet has ingested antifreeze, take them to your veterinarian or your local emergency hospital immediately for treatment with an antidote to prevent acute kidney failure.

If your furry kid has had contact or ingested any of the items on this list call your veterinarian for help immediately. If your pet has been exposed to something, you are not sure of and it is not on this list, contact one of the Animal Poison Centers. Pet Poison Help Line (855) 764-7661 or ASPCA Animal Poison Control (888) 426-4435

THANKSGIVING FOODS

Thanksgiving is often a time to enjoy family, friend and best of all food! Most common foods enjoyed during this time include mashed potatoes and gravy to stuffing, casseroles and who can forget the turkey. While we love to enjoy and share these foods with friends and family, it is best not to share with your pets. These foods are usually loaded with fats, onions, raisins, nutmeg, and other spices that may be harmful to your pets. Pets who eat these items are at risk of developing pancreatitis or other disorders of the stomach. These conditions can be painful and potentially fatal.

It is also best to not allow your pet to

chew on leftover bones. Bones can splinter and cause internal damage. They may also become stuck in the stomach or digestive tract or cause obstruction which may require surgery to remove it.

Avoid an emergency hospital visit during the holidays by keep your pet away from the dinner table.

ALCOHOL

Whether you are sipping a hard apple cider or enjoying your favorite mixed drink, pets should never be given alcohol. It depresses the nervous system and can also

be damaging to the kidneys. Warning signs your pet has consumed alcohol include vomiting, disorientation, and difficulty urinating. Other more serious signs include collapse and coma. Call your vet immediately if your pet has consumed alcohol.

Call your veterinarian if you notice your pet is acting lethargic or has vomiting or diarrhea. These could be signs your pet has ingested something they shouldn't have. Talk to your veterinarian, even if you are not sure you should bring your pet in for evalu-

Stay safe and keep your pets safe. 🙅






